Position Description

Army Physician Assistants exercise significant professional autonomy in medical decision making and provide a broad range of diagnostic and therapeutic services.

Those who serve in Active Duty (full-time) will practice at one of the 8 Army medical centers, 18 community hospitals, and 65 medical clinics across the country.

Those who serve in the Army Reserve (part-time) practice; ~48 days per year with a reserve unit in their area of choice while maintaining their civilian careers.
